GIOC Social Emotional Learning (SEL) & SAUSD

During the second rotation of the 2022-23 school year, Girls Inc. of Orange County provided three curricula to SAUSD students:

Lil' sheroes & sheroes

Sheroes (3rd-5th) and **Lil' Sheroes** (K-2nd) was offered to ten SAUSD schools. Participants explore the qualities that make up **strong leaders**, practice using **social media for good**, and learn how to be **safe online**.

influenceHER 

InfluenceHER was offered to 6th-8th graders at Mendez and Villa.

Participants developed an **understanding of their emotions** and **boosted their analytical skills**, all through the lens of social justice and advocacy.

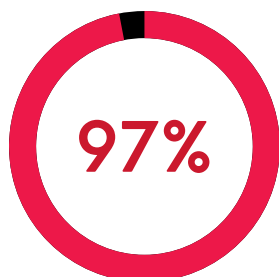

PROGRAM IMPACT

Girls Inc. of Orange County's "girls only" supportive and inclusive environment amplifies the impact of our programs. Girls are encouraged to speak up, ask questions, take risks without fear of failure, be open about how they are feeling, and ask for help when they need it. They also develop meaningful relationships with their peers, staff educators, and caring volunteers and mentors.

With a heavy emphasis on evaluation at both the national and local level, Girls Inc. of Orange County believes in implementing thorough evaluation for all of our programs. In addition to the curriculum created by Girls Inc. of Orange County educators, these programs were measured with a pre and post evaluation survey.
